



This map is based on a Hunting Map from 1912. The Railways have come and gone, leaving habitats and coverts in their place, the roads carry a lot more traffic and the odd by-pass has appeared along with revolutionary changes in agricultural practice.

Urban sprawl has nibbled the Cheltenham side, but the majority of the country remains unspoilt.

The Hunt and the wildlife of the Cotswolds have flourished together since 1858 and hunting plays a major role in the preservation of the rural heritage of Gloucestershire, enjoyed by all, sportsman or not. Hounds are seen all over the country only through the living tradition of goodwill and access from the Farmers and landowners large and small.
